From Our Pastor's Desk ... WALKING ON **EGGSHELLS**

One of the differences between working in psychotherapy and working as a Pastor is this: the client and I have an agreement that we will talk about problems and that I will listen, observe, and speak to what I see. In a congregation, there is no such agreement. In fact, in order to "keep the peace," it is often wise for a Pastor to keep his or her mouth shut and just go along to get along.

Sometimes a client will not want to talk about a particular issue that has arisen. We call that being defensive, which is not necessarily negative. To speak about the issue may threaten the person's sense of wellbeing in some way, so the topic is off the table, at least for a time. (continued on next page)

WALKING ON EGGSHELLS (continued from cover)

Often in congregations that have been in decline there is also a defensiveness. Most members cannot pinpoint why the congregation has declined or, if they can, they do not have the expertise to find solutions. So they often don't want the issues addressed and just want to act as if all is well.

Part of what I bring to my ministry has been the opportunity to study with the top "church growth" experts in the nation. I also have consulted for congregations about issues of church decline and growth.

Just like I do not expect my clients in psychotherapy to know how to solve their personal problems, I do not expect the members of CLC to know how to solve the issues of decline. But it helps if people are willing to listen non-defensively.

The issue I want to raise with you is the need for me to be able to speak freely about what I know and what I see. My intention is not to be critical, but to speak the truth about congregational decline and growth as I have come to know it through my training, study, and experience.

I sometimes feel like I must "walk on eggshells," so that people won't get upset.

But how does that help us move forward and put into place systems, programs, and building updates that offer the congregation an opportunity to flourish?

Is my job to protect members' feelings or to help get CLC back on her feet?

In my psychotherapy practice, I developed the reputation for being a truthful, direct, and successful mental health professional, helping people get back on their feet to once again lead meaningful and purposeful lives. I guess I am just as truthful and direct as a Pastor.


When we address personal problems and problems in congregational life, it always gets worse before it gets better. Accepting this truth does help us deal with the initial rough moments.

With your openness to hearing the truth about what we need to transform at CLC, I believe we can work together to lead the congregation into a viable and spirited future.

But I can't do my part if I have to "walk on eggshells."



Anyone who helped with the first phase of cleanup at the Church is advised to update their tetanus vaccine. This is not necessary for the ongoing Water Damage Cleanup.


2. All the carpet in the office, hallway on the first floor primary department needs removed. Volunteers needed.



REVISITING THE CALL PROCESS

Some members continue to ask questions about the Call Committee and others seem unclear about the call process.

Presently, we do not have a Call Committee. Why?

Two reasons:

- 1. CLC needs to address a number of issues before bringing a new Pastor on board. That is why we have a Transitional Interim Pastor. This is different than Pastor Kemp or Pastor Green serving as Interim Pastor. Pastor Scott has the task of helping the congregation makes needed transitions prior to calling a new Pastor. Typically, a Transitional Interim Pastor serves 18-24 months in order that the necessary issues are addressed.
- 2. There are no Pastors currently available that fit with the congregational profile of CLC. In fact, there are few Pastors currently available. St. John Lutheran, Carnegie, recently called a female Episcopalian priest after a lengthy vacancy because there were no suitable Lutheran Pastors.

There is no "call list" where we slowly move up until it is our turn. Pastor Sarah Lee-Faulkner of the Southwest PA Synod knows our congregation and will be in touch if a Pastor who fits our congregational profile becomes available.

All congregations in our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America are facing the same dilemma: Pastors of the "babyboom generation" are retiring by the thousands each year and fewer and fewer Pastors are entering and graduating from seminary. **Declining and smaller congregations are** the least attractive to the short supply of Pastors available.

Be assured that if a "good fit" for CLC becomes available, our Synod staff will let us know.








While I'm Gone . . .


