





## A Good Time to be the Church 1

As I was doing a lot of reading to write the series of articles on prayer I was looking through a number of books, many acquired at the book store at Synod (Conventions) Assemblies over the years, one title struck me among the others, A Good Time to be the Church, conversations with George H. Anderson who was elected Bishop of the ELCA in 1995. What I thought when I picked it up I don't remember, something like: what a crazy idea with what was going on in the world!

In a way that is exactly what he refers to; challenges are with the Lutheran Church, desegregation in the 50's, Viet Nam in the 60's, historical criticism in the 70's, the merger in the 80's and human sexuality in the 90's. He referred to these as 'messes' rather than problems, because problems are specific and individual, what faces the Church comes from a variety of sources.

"It seems that God just won't let the Church settle down and enjoy its triumphs. Every time we want to linger on the Mount of Transfiguration, God pushes us off the scenic viewpoint and lands us back in some valley."

The Church should be a working Church, a community of believers who having a relationship with Christ come together as a community in a community as the motto of CLC proclaims. Some long for the good old days but times were different, society was different, more stable than it is today. The demographics have shifted, the mobility of families economically, socially and job-wise. Multiculturalism, racial, ethnic, the globe has become a very small place and The Lutheran Church once the province of Germanic and Northern European people in Northern States has become more culturally diverse with the moves to the South and West.

"Openness to new religious experience offers us a chance to reach persons whose parents would never have considered the Lutheran Church. In fact, this openness puts us at the threshold of possibilities far greater than any we can imagine." *More to come*.



## **Optical Illusions**

Have you ever seen one of those pictures that changes depending on how you look at it? Is it a rabbit or a duck? Is it a vase or two faces looking at one another? A young woman or an old one? Sometimes our first impression of something gets in the way of us seeing it another way.

In the parable Jesus tells today, there is a man with wealth and influence who has always seen his life as a success. That success seems all the more pronounced in contrast to a poor, sick beggar who is always hanging around the entrance to his house. But when the rich man dies, he realizes that his life was actually the opposite of what he thought. It was not his possessions or status that mattered; it was the justice and love he showed to others. When it came to those things, he was far more impoverished and much sicker than the man he looked down on every day.

When we look at our own lives, it can be easy to get stuck in just one way of seeing them. If we focus on worldly standards, we may judge ourselves as successes or failures in ways that are out of touch with how God sees us. With this parable, Jesus calls us to new ways of looking at ourselves. Where are we missing the opportunities right outside our front door to act with love and justice for our siblings near and far?

In Christian worship, we gather to practice the way our lives and our world appear to God. We lift up the cries that have gone unheard. We look at one another and ourselves through the redemptive waters of baptism. We feed one another around the table that Christ sets for us all in our common need. As witnesses to God's truth, we send one another forth to shatter misguided illusions in the world around us. ~


