




Welcome PASTOR TRICIA SCHNECK

The Tweens

To anyone who has read The Hobbit and Lord of the Rings, the tweens are an awkward time of life, between being a teenager and thirty-three, and to the Church, the Sundays between Easter and Pentecost seem to fit into that mold. The Resurrection has occurred but Christ has not yet ascended to The Father. This seems to be a time of great confusion for the disciples, the other followers of Jesus, and the writers of the Gospels.

The accounts vary widely. He did not appear as the same Jesus, they did not recognize him until he revealed his identity. In one place, Mary Magdalene is not to hold on to him, in another, the disciples took hold of his feet and worshiped him. Was the experience so traumatic that none really could describe or remember the events exactly? Maybe Jesus too was in the tweens, no longer totally human and not totally God, that would come at the Ascension. He made appearances but performed no miracles.

Peter decides to go fishing. Even though Jesus had appeared to the disciples several times there seemed to be no real plan for the future and we then find seven of the disciples back home by the Sea of Tiberias (Galilee) where Simon Peter says, "I am going fishing." The others all follow, after all they were fishermen at heart and in times of uncertainty what can be a better tonic than doing something that is comfortable to do?

Throughout the night they caught nothing and in the morning Jesus, whom they did not recognize, was standing by a fire and told them to cast their nets on the other side of the boat with great success causing their instant recognition. "It is the Lord!" This was the third time the Gospel of John records Jesus appearing to a gathering of disciples.

With our knowledge of future events we might find it hard to believe what the disciples were actually going through. Events were happening that had not happened, their dead master was appearing to them yet in forms they did not recognize, how unsettling that must have been. We live beyond the Ascension and Pentecost, we have no reason not to recognize our Lord!

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER From Fear to Faith

Fight, flight, or freeze: that's how our bodies tend to react when we perceive danger. Our heart rate increases, our breathing speeds up, and even our vision changes to take in our surroundings quickly so we can protect ourselves. When Jesus appeared to the disciples on the evening of his resurrection, they seemed to be in the middle of a fight, flight, or freeze response. Their Lord had been crucified. They didn't know what to do next. When Jesus suddenly stood among them, they froze in shock and fear. Jesus overcame the disciples' fright by showing his hands and feet and by eating a piece of fish. As they looked at the scars and watched him eat, the truth of his resurrection dawned on them. The disciples' inclination to fight, flee, or freeze melted away.

Once Jesus had brought the disciples back to a calm resting state, he opened their minds to understand how he had accomplished God's plan to save the world. Jesus told the disciples that now that he was risen, it was their turn to tell his story in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth. Joy started to flicker in the disciples' hearts as Jesus freed them from fear. He gave them a purpose: to be his witnesses. They were to free others by sharing the good news that Jesus had died and risen again to forgive their sins and give the gift of eternal life to all who believe.

In our world today, many voices spread fear. It's easy to focus on those voices, feel overwhelmed, and freeze. But Jesus came to free us from fear and to free us for faith. Receiving the bread and wine of his supper reminds us that Jesus lived, died, and rose again for our salvation. We don't have to be afraid of anything. Holy communion strengthens us to be his witnesses and to do his work in the world so others can be set free by the good news of Jesus' love. ~


