



I also collaborated with The Conciliation Project in Richmond, Va. I have been looking for a Lutheran, ELCA church to play music with for some time now.


Thank you for offering me a musical and spiritual home. I am excited to share my talents as well.

Gone in Seconds

As I finish up this article it is Thursday the Church celebrates a most significant event, the **Ascension of our Lord**. Coming forty days after Easter, there's that number again, it always falls on the Thursday between the Sixth and Seventh Sundays of Easter.

Of all the Gospel writers Luke is the only one to describe such a miraculous event in his Gospel and in his Acts of the Apostles. There is an addendum at the end of Mark which appears to have been added much later by someone other than Mark. In the Gospel the Apostles are gathered together with Jesus and after leaving his final instructions he was carried up into heaven. In Acts we learn that after he was taken up by a cloud into heaven those remaining were chastised by two men in white robes for standing around and gawking when they already knew he will be returning and they have work to do on their own guided by the Spirit. That's another story for a coming article.

The Bible records only two other persons leaving earth without a trace; Elijah taken up into heaven by the fiery chariot in front of Elisha, a very dramatic intervention, and Enoch, in Genesis, a man known to have walked with God "then he was no more, because God took him." End of story.

This is the end of Christ's work on earth because he says he is going to prepare a place for his followers. Ascension, along with Easter and Pentecost which will be celebrated in ten days being fifty days after Easter and already a Jewish celebration are the oldest Christian events to be celebrated by the early Church. ~



SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER United in Christ

The concept of the Trinity, one God, three in one, one in three, can be a little hard, sometimes, to get ahold of. But perhaps what scripture's witness to the Trinity boils down to is this: Jesus is in constant communication, continual, active relationship with the Father. The Father is in constant communication, continual, active relationship with the Son. And the Spirit is in and with and between both, always its own presence, but always, nonetheless, one in active relationship, one in ceaseless communication, with both the Father and the Son. Jesus prays that we may be "one" in the same fashion.

Conflict happens in the body of Christ all the time. Sometimes it is over matters of great significance: how we read scripture, how we are to conduct our lives, how the church is to think and act as it comes head-to-head with the constant pull and tug of the culture within and around it. Sometimes the conflict is personal. We resist the neighbor, and worse, out of hurt, anger, and anxiety. Sometimes the conflict can seem to be over a matter of pure nonsense: which way pickles should be sliced, and why they should be sliced that way.

Where and how, then, is our hope of being "one," as our Lord has so prayed?

It is in this: whatever our conflict, we belong to one another. Whatever our conflict, we are called to work at staying in active relationship, honest communication. We are not one, finally, when the issues between us wane, or cease. We are one because the Lord of life holds us together in the promise of his love even when powerful forces, at one and the same time, pull us apart. We are one because the body and blood of Christ have been given to each of us, and all of us. ~

Matthias, Apostle Tuesday, May 14, 2024

Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.



Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, died 1160 Saturday, May 18, 2024

Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.
