

Worship Help


♦ Ushers

CAMP LUTHERLYN



A God Mystery

I love a good mystery . . . read Dashiell Hammett, Dorothy Sayers or Agatha Christie; they have given us iconic sleuths and mysteries. I'm also keen on watching the Hallmark Mystery Channel or the Ovation Network which have mysteries 24/7, though through repeats I often the know whodunnit before they do it.

The Bible is full of mysteries and the answer to the whodunnit is, "God did it!" God has his reasons and that should be sufficient. Why should we think about this? Well, the Church devotes one whole Sunday to the subject, the First Sunday after Pentecost is dedicated to the Holy Trinity, God as Father, God as Son, God as Holy Spirit, BUT One God with three personifications.

The Athanasian Creed which is occasionally recited on Trinity Sunday by the Church goes to great length in some 800 to 900 words over 44 verses to explain that which cannot be explained in human terms. Here are four of those verses:

"Now this is the catholic faith: We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons or dividing the divine being. For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Spirit is still another. But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory, coeternal in majesty. What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit."

I prefer to rely on the explanation of the Trinity given by Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen of New York City on his weekly television show of the 50's and 60's. I remember watching 'Life is Worth Living' on television Tuesday nights.

"What is water? H2O, that is its nature. As a liquid it's H2O, as ice it's H2O, as steam it's H2O. Its nature does not change, only the form. Thus it is with the nature of God, the nature does not change but only the form." Thus the creeds say, "God the Father Almighty, creator; the Son, Jesus, who took on flesh to atone for sin; the Holy Spirit proceeding from the Father and Son who works in mysterious ways!" ~

How Can These Things Be?

Given the many heated encounters between Jesus and Pharisees, the term *Pharisee* has become, for some, another word for "enemy of truth" or "opponent of God's promises for the world." In communities where divisions over what is true and false, good and bad, have become ironclad, often rankling relationships, it may seem familiar—even honorable—to hiss at Pharisees. But that wasn't Jesus' way.

Think first about people like the Samaritan woman at the well, or a centurion in Rome's brutal occupying army, or a scandalous prostitute, or an executioner driving nails into Jesus' flesh—people that might have been easily discarded. Yet Jesus related to them in compassion and mercy, not exclusion.

Then think of Nicodemus, meeting Jesus at night, calling him "a teacher who has come from God." Nicodemus is a Pharisee but he is hardly an enemy of truth opposing God's way in the world. Moreover, with one word, "we," he includes other Pharisees like himself who wish to accompany Jesus in God's kingdom.

The perplexing nighttime conversation that leaves Nicodemus in a state of wonderment—"How can these things be?"—leads to Jesus' climactic revelation: "God so loved the world . . ." In the gospel's original Greek, "world" (kosmos) indicates that literally every bit of the universe receives God's mercy and compassion, saving us all from perishing into iron-clad division between who is in and who it out.

How can these things be? On this Sunday that celebrates the wonder of the Trinity, the answer comes from God the Creator, saying that creation is good; from God the Redeemer, teaching us to love the world as God loves it; and from God the Spirit, continuing to draw us into wonderment. That's how this can be. ~

Upcoming Commemorations



John Calvin, renewer of the church, died 1564 Saturday, May 27, 2024

Gifted both as a systematic theologian and as an interpreter of scriptures, Calvin embraced the Reformation, and as a preacher in Geneva, Switzerland, brought a theocratic government to it. He is regarded as the father of the Reformed churches.




Jiri Tranovský, hymnwriter, died 1637 Monday, May 29, 2024

Tranovský is considered to be the father of Slovak hymnody as well as an important reformer of the Slavic church. He translated the Augsburg Confession (the basis of Lutheran teachings) and published a collection of Slovak hymns.



Visit of Mary to Elizabeth Wednesday, May 31, 2024

This festival marks the occasion when Mary, pregnant with Jesus, visited her cousin Elizabeth who was herself pregnant with John. Elizabeth pronounced Mary "blessed among women," and Mary responded with the song called the Magnificat.



Justin, martyr at Rome, died around 165 Thursday, June 1, 2024

Born of pagan parents, Justin was influenced by an elderly Christian in Ephesus. He became a teacher of philosophy and the Christian faith. Jailed for practicing an unauthorized religion, he refused to renounce his faith and was beheaded.
