

The Church's Crayon Box

Over the last few weeks the changing of the seasons within the church year the liturgical color of Green has crept into the topic as part of the Ordinary Sundays and the growth of the Church, both in each congregation and out into the world to spread the Good News. The Church displays many colors during the year, each one presenting a different mood, a different phase, a different focus.

The first color of the Church year for Advent is **Blue** signifying hopefulness and anticipation, a brilliant sky in the morning expecting a very good day!

White appears at Christmas up to Epiphany, this is the color of purity, the time when Our Lord "grew in wisdom and stature" to prepare him for the mission to come.

Green is the color for Epiphany with the revelation of Jesus' purpose and God's plan beginning to work in the world

The humility of **Purple** is the Lenten journey toward Easter, it denotes penitence and reflection, the royalty manifested in the Kingship of Jesus, Son of God.


Good Friday wears the **Black** of mourning, of loss, the brief time after the Crucifixion. The alternative is no paraments at all.

Once again White shows up for Easter or for that one Sunday, Gold! White will remain throughout the season until Pentecost. It is also used for special days of commemoration, Trinity, All Saints, Christ the King and Saints who were not martyred.

The **Red** of fire announces Pentecost, symbolic of the Holy Spirit descending as tongues of flame to ignite the words of the Apostles. During the year it symbolizes the blood of martyrs and the intervention of the Holy Spirit into the life of the Church.

One more color has been recently added: Rose, for the Third Sunday in Advent and the Fourth Sunday in Lent reflecting the call to rejoice in penitential seasons.

We often take these little things, things in the background, for granted unless our attention is called to them. Nevertheless, they are part of the whole worship experience like the music or reciting of prayers and creeds. ~



God Gives the Growth

In the life of faith, we often look at ourselves and wonder if we're really growing at all. The temptation to examine ourselves and despair over our flaws (or perhaps to look at others and judge their weaknesses) is ever-present. For us as Christians, the call to repentance is critical; we are to be aware of our shortcomings, confess them, and receive God's forgiveness. But we shouldn't be too hard on ourselves either.

In the gospel reading today, Jesus uses two farming or gardening analogies to portray the kingdom of God. In the first he describes the entire process—from planting, through the various growth phases, and finally to the harvest. In the second he speaks of the tiny mustard seed which, over time, grows so large that it provides shelter for other creatures.

This is the kingdom of God as a whole, and also the individual's life of faith. The seeds of faith are planted in holy baptism. Over time, God as gardener nurtures us through worship, prayer, holy communion, the practice of confession and absolution, and fellowship with other believers, such that we grow in faith toward God and love toward our neighbors. You, who started out as the tiniest of seeds or the greatest of sinners or were carelessly scattered by others, are gently tended by Jesus, the Master Gardener. You are brought into the kingdom of God so you can grow and thrive and become life-giving for others.

You may "not know how" this has happened; you may not notice it in yourself, or even in other people sometimes. But God gives the growth, and what God sets in motion will come to fruition. That we are promised. So be gentle with yourself and with others. Trust the Lord and be patient. You are being loved and nurtured and cared for, even at this very moment. ~

Emanuel Nine, martyrs, died 2015 Monday, June 17, 2024

On June 17, 2015, Clementa C. Pinckney, Cynthia Marie Graham Hurd, Susie Jackson, Ethel Lee Lance, DePayne Middleton-Doctor, Tywanza Sanders, Daniel Lee Simmons, Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, and Myra Thompson were murdered by a self-professed white supremacist while they were gathered for Bible study and prayer at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church (often referred to as Mother Emanuel) in Charleston, South Carolina. Pastors Pinckney and Simmons were both graduates of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. A resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance for the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine was adopted by the Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on August 8, 2019. Congregations of the ELCA are encouraged reaffirm their commitment to repenting of the sins of racism and white supremacy which continue to plague this church, to venerate the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine, and to mark this day of penitence with study and

prayer.

Onesimos Nesib, translator, evangelist, died 1931 Friday, June 21, 2024

Onesimos was born in Ethiopia. Captured, enslaved, and taken to Eritrea, he was there freed by Swedish missionaries. He translated the Bible into his native Oromo and returned to preach there.
